# **Credit for Prior Learning (CPL)**

College credit awarded for validated college-level skills and knowledge gained outside of a college classroom

### Benefits of CPL

- May earn up to 15 units per SRJC student record
- No fees associated with CPL
- Save time and money, lower the cost of tuition
- Accelerate academic progress, able to take higher level courses sooner
- · Experience equates to specific course



# Eligible Experience to Earn College Credit

- Military Service Credit (JST military transcripts) evaluation
  - ✓ Route to department of discipline to review military transcripts and determine credit course equivalency per ACE recommendations
- · Industry Certification/Accreditation or License evaluation
  - ✔ Route to department of discipline to evaluate the industry-recognized credential
- Student-Created Portfolio Review
  - ✓ Route to department of discipline to determine that the student-created portfolio measures sufficient mastery of the course content
- College Level Examination Program (CLEP)
  - ✔ Route to department of discipline to review for credit
- Credit by Examination
  - ✓ Administered by a college department in lieu of completion of a course listed in the college catalog
- Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate (IB)



# **Steps for Earning CPL Credits**

- 1. Meet with a Counselor
- 2. Submit a petition to Admissions & Records
  - · Must indicate a singular exact course for CPL, determined by department of the discipline
- 3. Academic department will return petition with specific course, unit value, and grade
- · Admissions & Records will record units to the student's record and add CPL course in the Transfer Credit Module as equivalent to a SRJC course
- 4. Update Student's Evaluation Worksheet and Major Worksheet
  - · Counselors will be able to see the CPL usage and advise students accordingly.



# **Looking Ahead**

- Create a shared database for students and staff
- Every student with that "same" certificate will be granted units/course equivalency
- Only student portfolios or new test/certificates will be sent to departments for approval
- Wish/Goal SRJC to adopt the current CSU College Level Examination Program (CLEP) examination passing scores chart and determine course-for-course equivalency
- Wish/Goal SRJC to adopt current Military Service Credit (JST military transcripts) based on the American Council on Education (ACE) military guide and determine course-for-course equivalency

# Cal-GETC Course Eligibility and Information

- Resources for Course Development and Revisions
- <u>Cal-GETC Standards v. 1.2</u> can be viewed for curriculum development or revision purposes
- All courses eligible for GE effective F25 <u>must already be UC Transfer Approved (UCTCA)</u> <u>prior to submission to the GE State Review process</u>
- Faculty working to develop or revise coursework in order to submit for GE, can contact me via email <a href="mailto:kblackwell@santarosa.edu">kblackwell@santarosa.edu</a> for resources and timelines
- No sunset date for CSU or IGETC course approvals; meaning students maintaining catalog rights will still be able to apply current and active CSU/IGETC approved coursework to their certifications of GE even after F25.
  - Example: Student takes MATH 10, S26 and has maintained GE rights to CSU GE pattern AY 23-24; course will be applied, etc)

# **AB 1111 – Common Course Numbering**

### Subject

Based on 4-letter abbreviations. A systemlevel list of abbreviations should be standard.

### Course Type Identifier

C = Common Course Number A "C" identifier indicates that course is transferable to any other CCC. A local course would not have a "C" identifier.

# SUBJ C####&&

### Course Number (####)

Level of course number indicates transferability.

0XXX - Non-baccalaureate

1XXX - 100-level course

2XXX - 200-level course

3XXX - 300-level course

4XXX - 400-level course

9XXX - Non-credit

- Provides for 1000 courses at each level per discipline per identifier type.
- Other levels could be defined at the system level as needs are identified.
- Major articulations would be indicated locally at colleges via catalog, class schedule, etc.

### Course Specialty Identifier (&&)

A system-level key could define options: (examples)

H = Honors Course

L = Lab Only Course

S = Support Course

- Up to 2 specialty identifiers can be attached to a course
- A course with no identifiers would not have fillers in those fields.

# **Disciplinary Overlap Process Updates**

- New course development or course revision occurs in consultation with the department chair.
  - Complete initial research regarding similar courses and course content in SRJC's course inventory to ensure there is <u>minimum to</u> no disciplinary overlap.
- New Course Announcement or Course Renumbering email sent by End of Week 12
  - Concerned faculty member\_(after consulting with department chair)
     notifies Curriculum Office of perceived conflict or overlap.



# **Disciplinary Overlap Process Updates**

- . Initial meeting includes:
  - Faculty submitter and department chair
  - Department Chair of concerned faculty member and the concerned faculty member or other department colleague.



# **Disciplinary Overlap Process Updates**

- If conflict requires CRC attention:
  - 1st CRC Meeting-Business Item Agenda
    - Informative presentations from each department, including Q/A after each presenter has 4 minutes to present their case.
    - Vote to agendize course at following meeting
  - 2nd CRC Meeting-
    - Review course in alignment with regular CRC practices, except that 30 minutes allowed for course review.



# **Cluster Tech Review Committee Updates**

- Cluster Tech Review Checklist Updated
- Faculty submitters should revise their courses in their entirety using the Cluster Tech Checklist and IDEAA principles as guides. (Both available in <u>Handbook</u>)
- 20 minutes allotted for each course review at a CTRC meeting
  - If more time is needed, CTRC Co Chairs will invite faculty submitter to revise course and return to a future CTRC meeting.



# **IDEAA** Principles and the Course Outline of Record

- Student-centered, jargon-free, and inclusive language throughout
- Active voice in course description focused on what students will do in the course:
  - Students will study
  - Students will examine
- Include Open Educational Resources
- Include options for a range of formative and summative assessments



## **SRJC's SLO Preamble**

- Program Course Approval Handbook (PCAH)
  - "Note: The term "objectives" is used in Title 5. The term "learning outcomes" is used in the ACCJC Eligibility Requirements, Standards, and Commission Policies per federal requirements. Definitions and use of the two terms may differ depending on local practice."
  - SRJC Preamble:
